"IT TAKES A FAMILY" (Genesis 2:18-25) s

Introduction:

- 1. A few years ago, a book entitled, <u>It Takes A Village</u>, was a best seller.
 - a. It was written by a prominent politician.
 - b. It set forth the idea that society as a whole, not just the family, was responsible for raising children.
- 2. What is today called "the traditional family" was ordained by God Himself.
 - a. The "traditional family" consists of a husband and his wife and their children.
 - b. God established the family in the Garden of Eden.
 - c. The family is the oldest institution in the world.
 - d. It is also the most basic of all other institutions in society.
- 3. The family has been the backbone of all civilizations.
 - a. Edward Gibbon listed disintegration of the family as one of five major causes leading to the fall of the Roman Empire.
 - b. Pres. James A. Garfield said: "The sanctity of marriage and the family relation makes it the cornerstone of American society and civilization."
- 4. There is a crisis today in America in government, morality, the economy, crime, and overall quality of life.
 - a. The origin of this crisis can be traced back to the disintegration of the American family.
 - b. Government programs, conferences, and allocation of taxpayer funds have done nothing to alleviate the crisis.
- 5. God created the home as the first of all other institutions.
- 6. We are going to examine God's plan for the family in a series of lessons.

Discussion:

- I. GOD CREATED THE HEAVENS AND THE EARTH IN SIX DAYS (GEN. 1).
 - A. Each act of creation was in preparation for the act to follow.
 - B. When all was in readiness, man was created last of all (Gen. 1:27).

- 1. Man was God's crowning act of creation.
- 2. Man was placed in the Garden of Eden (Gen. 2:15-17).

II. GOD CREATED WOMAN AS A COMPANION FOR MAN (GEN. 2:18-22).

- A. God "saw that it was not good for man to be alone."
 - 1. Man needed a companion on his social, spiritual and intellectual level for he is made in God's image.
 - 2. God said, "I will make a helper comparable to him."
 - 3. God caused all the animals to pass before man, "but for Adam there was not found a helper comparable to him"(Gen. 2:19,20)
- B. God created woman for man and from man (Gen. 2:21-23).
 - 1. God caused a "deep sleep to fall on Adam."
 - 2. He took from Adam's side a "rib" and made woman.
 - 3. When Adam saw Eve, he said:

"This is now bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; she shall be called 'woman' because she was taken out of man."

III. GOD GAVE HIS MARRIAGE LAW AT THE BEGINNING (GEN. 2:24).

A. God's marriage law is very simple:

"Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh."

- 1. When the Jews asked Jesus about divorce, He referred them to God's original plan (Matt. 19:3-9).
- 2. He emphasized that marriage consists of only one man and one woman by adding the word "two" (Matt. 19:5).
- 3. God intended the marriage union to be for life.
- 4. Jesus permitted only one exception to God's original law:

"And I say to you, whoever divorces his wife, except for sexual immorality, and marries another, commits adultery; and whoever marries her who is divorced commits adultery" (Mt.19:9).

- B. A simple summary of God's marriage law is:
 - 1. "One man, one wife for life!"
 - 2. The only exception is that an innocent partner has the right to divorce a partner guilty of fornication and marry again.

IV. CURRENT FORCES ARE UNDERMINING THE FAMILY.

- A. Secular humanism permeates education and the media.
 - 1. It is based on evolution which says that man is merely an animal.
 - 2. It rejects any absolute standard of right and wrong.
 - 2. Marriage becomes merely an evolved social form that can be varied or replaced.
- B. The homosexual agenda strikes at the very heart of the home.
 - 1. God created marriage for a man and a woman.
 - 2. Only a man and a woman can have children and perpetuate the human race (Gen. 1:28).
- C. The radical Women's Liberation Movement opposes the family as God set it up.
 - 1. Women who choose to be wives and mothers are ridiculed.
 - 2. The God given role of the husband and father as head of the family is opposed (Eph. 5:22,23).
- D. The ease and acceptance of divorce is a major factor in the decline of the family.
 - 1. The divorce rate has sharply increased since the 1950's.
 - 2. People living together without being married is widespread and widely accepted today (Heb. 13:4).
 - 3. Children from one parent homes are at much greater risk:
 - a. They are more likely to get in trouble in school and drop out earlier.
 - b. They are more likely to be in trouble with the law.
 - c. They are more likely to live below the poverty level.
 - d. They are at much greater risk of becoming involved in drugs and gangs.
 - e. They are more likely to be subject to child abuse.

Conclusion:

- 1. There is no substitute for the family as God ordained it.
- 2. It is the basic building block of all society.
- 3. Most of our social, economic, and moral problems would be solved if we returned to God's plan for the family.
- 4. To have a Christian home, one must become a Christian (Mark 16:15,16).
